Why would Jesus do something so absurd as to accept God's plan for him to die as an innocent man? Why did he submit to torture and death to bring forgiveness to people who continue to ignore him?

The Old Testament tells of God's love for human creatures. He formed them with his own hands, and he put them in charge of a beautiful world created with amazing grandeur and perfection!¹ But over and over, people chose to think about themselves first, disregarding God, and they did things their own way – which always resulted in a MESS. The Bible calls this sin or disobedience.²

Every time, God reached out to say, "I love you" and "I have plans for your good". But humans, like myself, said, "I don't trust that you really love me and I'd prefer my own comfort to your plans!"³

Generations came and went with less and less people willing to step out on faith and rely on God's love for them. Most thought that God's loving plan should include an easy life, with plenty of comfort. But... there were some who dared to believe differently.

My favorite story is found in the book of Ruth (for obvious reasons!). Ruth was a person who believed that God loved her, even while she was hungry, without a home, and mourning the death of her young husband.⁴ She had a bold willingness to look for God's plan, even when it didn't make sense, and it brought her to an encounter with a man who was the son of a prostitute (named Rahab). Years earlier, Rahab had also dared to believe

that God could love her in the middle of an awful place, during times of war and destruction.⁵

Together with her husband, Ruth raised a family, and had a young grandson who killed a huge giant and later became king of their country. From his family would come the greatest King of all - Jesus.⁶

But Jesus' arrival on earth was not kingly - it looked NOTHING like a "perfect plan". His birth would look like poor timing (no appropriate facilities were available)⁷, his early child-hood years were spent in hiding (in a foreign country and culture)⁸ and his adulthood was full of misunderstandings and lies about him.⁹ So much for God's "loving plan".

But, the amazing truth is that God love shines greatest against the darkness of the world's sin. ¹⁰ God would ask Jesus to let his beautifully created creatures bring torture to his body and to his heart. They would accuse Jesus of lies and claim he deserved to die. ¹¹ They would nail his hands to wood, not recognizing them as the same hands which created each tree. ¹² They would spit in his face, and never desire to know that his spit once mixed with dirt to form the very first man. ¹³

WHY would Jesus do this – and WHY would God, his father, ask him to? There is no explanation that is humanly possible – just supernatural LOVE! 14

When someone boldly declares a love so strong toward us, we may react in several different ways.

First, we can be skeptical to believe it, and we want to see their words backed up with actions.

And if we see their actions, we may feel unworthy of their love, or embarrassed at the extravagance of their demonstrations. Perhaps we don't respect who they are and we wish they would choose someone else to love. Or we respect them too much, and push them away, afraid they will discover how very unlovely I really am.

God has answers for each of these objections. He says "I am a holy God, and I see how filthy you are – but still I love you!" ¹⁵ He proves his love by making a plan of forgiveness, ¹⁶

giving us life,¹⁷ and daily care¹⁸. He doesn't want to be pushed away, but asks us to welcome him.¹⁹

You may wonder, HOW can we welcome these amazing gifts of love? God simply wants us to believe his love—accepting the new life²⁰ that was made possible when Jesus said, "Not my will, but yours be done". Those nails and the sword, which poured out his blood and his life, made Jesus the once-for-all payment for our sin and disobedience.²¹

We accept it ONCE. We apply it DAILY. We are welcomed FOREVER into God's family. 22

Here on earth God walks with us, and gives us power²³. Someday in heaven, we will walk with him, and give him constant praise²⁴.
